

## CHANNEL ONE NEWS SHOW SCRIPT 11/27/07

TONY: HEY GUYS, IT IS TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 27TH. I'M TONY ANDERSON AND TODAY YOU'LL MEET A TEEN WHO'S SAYING SHOW ME THE MONEY, BUT FIRST CHECK OUT THE HEADLINES OF THE DAY.

JESSICA: DO YOU LOOK FORWARD TO QUESADILLA WEDNESDAYS AT YOUR SCHOOL CAFETERIA OR DO YOU GRAVITATE TOWARDS THE SALAD BAR?

JESSICA: YOU'D THINK MOST TEENS WOULD GO FOR THE HI-CALORIE MEXICAN.

JESSICA: BUT ACCORDING TO A NEW UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA STUDY, SCHOOL LUNCH SALES ACTUALLY DON'T DECLINE WHEN HEALTHY CHOICES ARE ON THE MENU.

JESSICA: AND, RESEARCHERS SAY IT DOESN'T COST ANY MORE FOR SCHOOLS TO PREPARE HEALTHIER ALTERNATIVES.

CHRIS: REPUBLICAN SENATOR TRENT LOTT HAS ANNOUNCED HE WILL RESIGN BY THE END OF THE YEAR.

CHRIS: LOTT IS CURRENTLY THE MINORITY WHIP, WHICH MEANS HE IS THE SECOND HIGHEST RANKING REPUBLICAN IN CONGRESS. WHERE HE'S SERVED FOR 34 YEARS.

CHRIS: MANY WASHINGTON INSIDERS ARE SURPRISED BY THE MOVE, SINCE LOTT'S TERM IS NOT SET TO EXPIRE UNTIL 2012.

(SOT: Sen. Trent Lott) "For a boy from Pascagoula, Mississippi it's been quite a wild ride. But a very enjoyable one and one that I'm proud of.

CHRIS: LOTT IS THE SIXTH VETERAN REPUBLICAN TO ANNOUNCE HE WON'T SEEK RE-ELECTION. THAT MEANS, WHEN YOU VOTE IN YOUR FIRST FEDERAL ELECTION IN 2008, 2010 OR 2012 CONTROL OF CONGRESS MAY HANG IN THE BALANCE.

JESSICA: SEVEN SWANS A-SWIMMING, SIX GEESE A-LAYING, FIVE GOLDEN RINGS. EVER WONDER HOW MUCH IT WOULD ACTUALLY COST TO GIVE THOSE ITEMS AS PRESENTS?

JESSICA: WELL, ACCORDING TO PNC WEALTH MANAGEMENT, IT WOULD COST MORE THAN 78 THOUSAND DOLLARS TO BUY THE 364 ITEMS NAMED IN "THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS."

JESSICA: THAT PRICE TAG IS UP FOUR PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR. INCREASED FOOD PRICES CAUSED THE COST OF SIX GEESE A-LAYING TO JUMP FROM 300 DOLLARS TO 360 DOLLARS.

JESSICA: NOT EVERYTHING SAW A PRICE HIKE TWO TURTLE DOVES WILL SET YOU BACK 40 DOLLARS, THE SAME AS LAST YEAR.

CHRIS: THE FIRE THAT RAVAGED MALIBU, CALIFORNIA ON SATURDAY MAY HAVE BEEN CAUSED BY PEOPLE PARTYING AT A CAMPFIRE.

CHRIS: FIRE DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS SAY HUMANS STARTED THE FIRE. WHILE THEY HAVEN'T PINPOINTED THE CAUSE, LOCAL RESIDENTS SAY THE AREA WHERE THE FIRE BEGAN IS A POPULAR PARTY SPOT FOR YOUNG PEOPLE.

CHRIS: THE FIRE DESTROYED 53 HOMES AND DAMAGED AT LEAST 34 MORE. THE FIRE IS NOW CONTAINED, AND OFFICIALS ARE WORKING TO DETERMINE THE CAUSE.

JESSICA: TODAY, THE START OF A BOLD NEW MIDEAST PEACE INITIATIVE. PRESIDENT BUSH WILL HOST LEADERS FROM 40 NATIONS IN ANNAPOLIS, MARYLAND FOR A SERIES OF TALKS ABOUT THE ISRAELI-PALESTINIAN CONFLICT.

JESSICA: RELATIONS BETWEEN ISRAELIS AND PALESTINIANS HAVE BEEN STRAINED FOR DECADES. THE TWO SIDES HAVE LONG DISPUTED WHO SHOULD GOVERN THE WEST BANK AND THE GAZA STRIP.

JESSICA: ISRAELI AND PALESTINIAN OFFICIALS HAD REACHED A STALEMATE IN PEACE TALKS. PRESIDENT BUSH HOPES THE MEETINGS WHICH REPRESENTATIVES FROM SYRIA AND SAUDI ARABIA WILL ALSO ATTEND WILL JUMP-START NEGOTIATIONS.

JESSICA: PRESIDENT BUSH WHO SAYS RESOLVING THE CONFLICT IS A TOP PRIORITY OF HIS ADMINISTRATION HE MET WITH ISRAELI AND PALESTINIAN OFFICIALS YESTERDAY TO LAY THE GROUNDWORK FOR THIS WEEK'S MEETINGS.

TONY: WORLD LEADERS ARE HOPING TO MAKE PROGRESS IN THE ISRAELI-PALESTINIAN CONFLICT. SO LET'S TEST YOUR KNOWLEDGE ON SOME OF THE KEY PLAYERS.

TONY: WHO'S THIS?

TONY: TAKE FIVE

TONY: IT'S EHUD OLMERT. HE WAS ELECTED PRIME MINISTER OF ISRAEL IN APRIL 2006. OLMERT MET WITH PRESIDENT BUSH MONDAY ALONG WITH PALESTINIAN PRESIDENT MAHMOUD ABBAS.

ANNOUNCER: FOR MORE ON THE ISSUES PRESIDENT BUSH AND OTHER LEADERS MIGHT BE TALKING ABOUT THIS WEEK GO TO CHANNEL ONE DOT COM AND CLICK ON CONFLICT IN THE MIDDLE EAST.

TONY: FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 70 YEARS, THE SUPREME COURT HAS DECIDED TO LOOK AT THE SECOND AMENDMENT. THE SECOND AMENDMENT ADDRESSES THE RIGHT TO KEEP AND BEAR ARMS. CHRIS BROWNE TELLS US WHY THE DECISION TO HEAR THEIR STORY COULD HAVE A BIG IMPACT ON THE GUN CONTROL DEBATE.

CHRIS: IT`S THE BIGGEST AND MOST IMPORTANT TEST OF THE SECOND AMENDMENT, THE RIGHT TO BEAR ARMS IN 70 YEARS.

CHRIS: THE SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES, THE HIGHEST COURT IN THE COUNTRY, ANNOUNCED LAST WEEK IT WOULD DECIDE WHETHER THE CONSTITUTION GUARANTEES PRIVATE CITIZENS THE RIGHT TO KEEP GUNS IN THEIR HOMES FOR PRIVATE USE.

CHRIS: IT'S THE FIRST TIME THE COURT WILL ADDRESS THE RIGHT TO BEAR ARMS SINCE 1939.

(SOT: WAYNE LAPIERRE National Rifle Association) "This will be the clearest Supreme Court decision we've ever had on this subject, it looks like."

CHRIS: NO ONE KNOWS FOR SURE, BUT IT'S ESTIMATED THAT MORE THAN 80 MILLION AMERICANS OWN A GUN. THE RIGHT COMES FROM THE CONSTITUTION, BUT IT'S NEVER BEEN CLEARLY DEFINED.

CHRIS: THOUGH THE SECOND AMENDMENT IS JUST 27 WORDS LONG, DEBATE HAS RAGED FOR DECADES ABOUT WHAT IT ACTUALLY MEANS. IT READS,

CHRIS: A WELL REGULATED MILITIA, BEING NECESSARY TO THE SECURITY OF A FREE STATE, THE RIGHT OF THE PEOPLE TO KEEP AND BEAR ARMS, SHALL NOT BE INFRINGED.

CHRIS: IN MARCH, THE COURT WILL BEGIN HEARING ARGUMENTS FOR AND AGAINST WASHINGTON D.C.'S 31 YEAR OLD BAN ON OWNING HANDGUNS, AND KEEPING WORKING RIFLES AND SHOTGUNS AT HOME.

CHRIS: LAWMAKERS SAY THE BAN WAS DESIGNED TO REDUCE GUN VIOLENCE IN A CITY WHERE FOUR OUT OF EVERY FIVE HOMICIDES ARE COMMITTED WITH A GUN.

CHRIS: BUT THIS PAST SPRING, A FEDERAL APPELLATE COURT SHOT THE LAW DOWN SAYING DC'S TOTAL HANDGUN BAN IS NOT COMPATIBLE WITH A PERSON'S RIGHT TO BEAR ARMS UNDER THE SECOND AMENDMENT.

CHRIS: NOW, THE SUPREME COURT HAS ANNOUNCED THAT THEY WILL EVALUATE THE LOWER COURT'S RULING, AND DECIDE ONCE AND FOR ALL WHETHER THE GUN BAN WILL STAND.

CHRIS: WITH A DECISION EXPECTED SOME TIME IN JUNE, THE COURT HAS ALL BUT GUARANTEED THAT GUN CONTROL WILL BE A BIG ISSUE IN THE UPCOMING 2008 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION.

(SOT: Michelle da Silva) "I think it's more important the safety of the public because if someone has a handgun in their home for protection, if something ever happens, they could commit a crime."

(SOT: Orlando Sonza) "I think that the individual's right to protect himself by owning a weapon is more important in this case. Every individual should have the right to protect themselves, and by protecting themselves it goes along with protecting the entire population."

CHRIS: IF THE COURT DECIDES GUN OWNERSHIP IS AN INDIVIDUAL RIGHT, THEN STRICT GUN CONTROL LAWS LIKE THOSE IN CHICAGO, LOS ANGELES, AND NEW

YORK COULD BE IN TROUBLE. AND HOWEVER THE COURT RULES, ITS DECISION TO EXAMINE THE AMENDMENT MEANS AN HISTORIC LEGAL SHOWDOWN OVER GUN CONTROL NEXT YEAR.

CHRIS BROWNE, CHANNEL ONE NEWS

(SOT: ) "Hi I'm Mr. Mason from PCM community school district in Prairie City Iowa. I'd like to give a shout out to all the students and staff."

(SOT: Jasmine Lawrence) "When I was 11 years old I got a relaxer put in my hair and it caused almost all of my hair to break out. That really traumatized me. I decided not to use any more chemicals, so I started to look for products with natural ingredients but I couldn't find any out there that really worked for me. So, I decided to make my own."

JESSICA: JASMINE WENT ONLINE TO LEARN WHICH NATURAL INGREDIENTS WORK BEST ON HAIR

(SOT: Jasmine Lawrence) "For dandruff I use the peppermint tea tree oil."

JESSICA: FIRST TEST SUBJECTS JASMINE'S MOM AND SISTER. WHEN SHE DISCOVERED HER STUFF ACTUALLY WORKED. IT WASNT LONG BEFORE SHE BEGAN PEDDLING HER PRODUCTS DOOR TO DOOR TO SALONS LIKE THIS ONE.

(SOT: Jasmine Lawrence) "These three together for 20."

JESSICA: BUT WOULD YOU DOLE OUT CASH FOR SHAMPOOS MADE BY A TEEN? AS JASMINE FOUND OUT AOME BUYERS WERE SKEPTICAL.

(SOT: Jasmine Lawrence) "Some people didn't want to try my product because I was 13 years old going from door to door. They didn't trust me, they didn't know me."

JESSICA: WITH HELP FROM NIFTY, THE NATIONAL FOUNDATION FOR TEACHING ENTREPRENEURSHIP. JAMSINE MADE A BUSINESS PLAN, AND LEARNED OTHER TIPS. LIKE HOW TO DRESS!

(SOT: Jasmine Lawrence) "When I dress in my business suit some people think why is she dressing up? But a lot of people see me for the business woman I am becoming."

JESSICA: AND THE BUSINESSWOMAN SHE ALREADY IS. NOW JASMINE HAS A FACTORY MASS PRODUCING HER LINE. SHE ALSO MEETS WITH BUSINESSMEN AND WOMEN WHO HAVE MILLIONS OF DOLLARS READY TO INVEST.

(SOT: Jasmine Lawrence) "I looked them in the eyes and told them the truth about my company. How I started where I came from. They were excited that I was doing it at such a young age."

JESSICA: JASMINE'S OILS, SHAMPOOS AND CONDITIONERS CAN BE FOUND IN WALMART. SHE'S PLANNING ON EXPANDING EVEN MORE. HER NEWEST PROJECT? MAKING CANDLES THAT EVOKE DIFFERENT MOODS.

JESSICA: TRY THE ENERGY ONE. EVERYONE NEEDS MORE ENERGY RIGHT?

JESSICA: VERY INVIGORATED! SO WHAT AM I SMELLING RIGHT NOW?

(sot: Jasmine Lawrence) "That is peppermint, spearmint."
